**Six events have been carried out within this project:**

**Event 1**

**Participation:** The event involved 57 citizens, including 55 participants from Poland, mainly from Warsaw, 1 from Lithuania and 1 from France.

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Warsaw, Poland on March 30, 2019.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Event 2**

**Participation:** The event involved 32 citizens, including 26 participants from Lithuania, the remaining 6 people came from Poland (2), France (1), Finland (2) and New Zealand (1).

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Kaunas, Lithuania on April 25, 2019.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Event 3**

**Participation:** The event involved 31 citizens, including 28 participants from the city of Riga (Latvia), the other 3 came from Poland, Finland and Lithuania.

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Riga, Latvia on June 10, 2019.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Event 4**

**Participation:** The event involved 26 citizens, including 23 participants from Estonia, 3 from Poland, Finland and Latvia.

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Tallinn, Estonia on September 16, 2019.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Event 5**

**Participation:** The event involved 32 citizens, including 28 participants from the city of Porin (Finland), and 4 people from Poland, Lithuania, France and Latvia.

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Porin, Finland on October 3, 2019.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Event 6**

**Participation:** The event involved 29 citizens, including 13 participants from Belgium, 6 people from Latvia, 5 people from Poland, 2 people from France, 1 from Estonia, 1 from Lithuania, 1 from Finland.

**Location / Dates:** The event took place in Brussels, Belgium on 4 February 2020.

**Short description:** The meeting was devoted to the implementation of the debate on the subject of the project and the opening of the exhibition.

**Participation:** The project enabled 208 citizens to meet at 6 events organised within this project.

**Preparatory activities:**

During the preparatory stage of the project (October-December 2018), we regularly organized (every week) an on-line workshop of our consortium. They were operated by the office of WiseEuropa in Warsaw. During the meetings we were discussing the timeline of the project, administrative and financial issues and the content and visual outlook of exhibition. The combined number of participants of preparatory activities exceeded 10 persons.

**Project description:**

The project '**The Emergence of New States in Eastern Europe in 1918 – Lessons for Entire Europe**' (TENSE), implemented by WiseEuropa, was completed In March 2020. It was a project that focused on the process of building nations after 1918 in Eastern Europe. The project aimed to increase knowledge in a region characterized by common features of processes presenting nations as a system of connected vessels, but also to show the differences between them, placing them in a broader European context. In order to achieve all project goals there were established a consortium gathering various actors from the Eastern Europe varying from local administration through think-tanks and academia up to journals which published a report and series of articles on the post-First World War nation-building processes in the Eastern Europe and their relevance for the current Europe. They were based on regional approach to the region trying to extract the main common elements of this period. The main message of these publications were transformed into public exhibition which were presented in all participant countries and in Brussels in order to reach out a wider audience in Europe.
